




Summer 2016 - Big Friendly Read Challenge

FOR YOUR ATTENTION

Just a reminder that our dinner provider has changed from Taylor Shaw to Dolce.

Please remember to send your email address to the office, so we can forward this on to Dolce for the new dinner procedures.

Dolce is an online dinner provider where parents provide a working email address and a live kitchen account will be created, with your own parent login. You will then be able to order meals of choice for your child, and look up the recipes to check what is put into the meal. Alternatively pupils will be able to use the school IPads to order the dinner they would like that day

The cost of the meal will be £2.10 (£10.50 a week). Children in F2 and KS1 will continue to still receive a free universal school meal, as well as children entitled to free school meals.

Payment for meals can be made by logging into your live kitchen account and paying by direct debit, or a payment can be made online. For the interim period you can continue to pay by cash, but this will only be until October as then all payments will need to be either by direct debit or online. No cash will be accepted after October, and if arrangements have not been put in place this may mean you will be unable to order a school dinner for your child. Dolce is aiming towards a cashless system which we have only just been made aware of.

A deposit box will be provided in school for the deposit of any cash. The cash will need to be in an envelope with all details clearly marked on the front. This will then be passed to the school dinner provider - Dolce. Payment must be made for a full week and not daily. Accounts will not be able to fall into arrears or dinners will NOT be provided.

The school office will not handle any of the cash, or be able to give any change. Please Note

Dinner accounts from last year with an amount outstanding will be receiving a letter this week. Please ensure any dinner money outstanding is paid as soon as possible.

Please do bear with us as we settle in with our new dinner provider. If you have any feedback then do let us know.



This year's theme for Harvest Fast Day is "Brighten Up this Harvest and Build a Brighter World". On Monday, 10th October, we will be having a whole school assembly from CAFOD to start our day.

For £1.00, all children will be able to dress up in BRIGHT colours for the day. For example: bright shirts, socks, ties, leggings, trousers, etc.

YEAR FOUR CLASS SWIMMING LESSONS

The Y4 Class will be going swimming from Friday 16th September after lunch at approx. 1.30pm, until further notice.

Pupils will be accompanied by school staff at all times, and they will be taught by qualified swimming instructors, supported by our staff. All pupils are expected to take part as swimming is a national curriculum subject. They will be travelling by coach to and from the venue.

Please can you ensure your child has their swimming kit in school that day. Pupils will need to wear appropriate swimwear (bikinis/shorts below the knee, underwear, are not acceptable). For each lesson your child will need to bring swimwear and a towel in a waterproof bag.

If your child needs to wear swimming goggles these must be provided by the parent and please complete the permission form attached to the newsletter, and return to class.

The swimming service has a no jewellery policy so please avoid any piercing until after the block of lessons or your child may miss out on their swimming allocation(taping is not acceptable as it will come off in the water). Hair must be tied back .

ATTENTION YEAR FOUR PARENTS

We are very pleased to announce that we are offering a 1 night residential to Year four pupils on Tuesday 4th April 2017. The residential will take place at Kingswood Peak Venture at Penistone.

The stay will include all accommodation, including 3 meals provided of breakfast, lunch and dinner, and refreshments during the stay.

It will also include 6 day time activities (to be decided) and also 1 evening activity.

The children will travel from school by coach on Tuesday 4th April to Kingwood Peak Venture in Penistone. They will arrive in time for lunch and then participate in three activities before the evening meal and a further activity in the evening. The following day the children will have breakfast and participate in further activities before having lunch and making their way back to school by coach.

The cost for the accommodation including all meals and supervised activities is £54 per child.

There will also be a further cost of approx. £20 for the coach return travel, making the total cost to be approx. £74.00.

The cost of the coach will depend on how many children take part in the residential trip, and we will not be able to go ahead with the trip unless we have at least 20 children taking part. We would ideally encourage the whole class to take part in the residential trip, as this will be a very valuable experience for your child.

We will be offering an information session for parents to attend in the near future to find out more about the activities the children will be participating in and further information on the Kingswood Centre. We will also be giving you information on clothing and footwear the children will need for the trip.

For now we would like you to confirm below if you would like your child to take part in the Y4 Residential trip and include a £20 deposit, which will be needed to secure the booking with the Kingswood Centre. The final date for this will be the 7th October. If we do not receive enough interest to make the trip viable to go ahead we will of course return your £20 deposit.
