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Thank you to our F2 parents/carers who have responded really well to the changes in drop off and pick up. We hope that this has made a positive difference to reducing congestion around the F2 entrance/exit.

Testing those who are symptomatic is a key strategy in managing and reducing the spread of the virus.

Detailed below is the government guidance on what the symptoms are of Covid19:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

In line with DFE guidance, anyone who is symptomatic we are asking that they are tested. School has received guidance from the Local Authority, which states that where families will not engage with the testing process, school will not be able to authorise the absence and as such, no schoolwork will be provided during the period of absence. Please note period of isolation for the person with symptoms is 10 days from the start of symptoms, a household member would need to isolate for 14 days.

We would like to thank all the families who have been supporting the school by adhering to social distancing and safety measures on site. We are concerned that a minority of our school community deem it unacceptable that we are asking them to adhere to these measures on school premises. The measures the school have implemented are concurrent with Government guidelines and are in place to help limit the spread of the virus. If any parents/carers/visitors to the school site consider for any reason they are unable to follow these systems and procedures, then please explain why, in writing for the attention of the Governing Body.

The start of the new term has been very successful working under the new stringent safety measures, the children have settled in and have adapted exceptionally well, they are a credit to all of us.

TRIPS AND EVENTS - 2020/21

Y4 RESIDENTIAL TRIP TO KINGSWOOD PEAK VENTURE IN PENISTONE

Wednesday 21 April 2021 to Friday 23 April 2021

POLITE REMINDER: THE £40.00 DEPOSIT FOR THIS TRIP IS DUE BEFORE 28TH SEPTEMBER 2020

We have been offering a residential trip to Kingswood Adventure Centre in Penistone for the Y4 class for the last three years, which has proved to be very successful. Next year the proposed trip will be a 2 night residential and will take place between Wednesday 21 April 2021 staying for 2 nights and returning on Friday 23 April 2021.

The stay will include all accommodation, meals at breakfast, lunch, dinner and refreshments, across the 3 days. It will also include daytime and evening activities.

The children will travel from school by coach on Wednesday 21 April 2021 to Kingswood Peak Venture in Penistone. They will arrive in time for lunch. On the Friday after having lunch we will make our way back to school by coach. Throughout the stay, the children will participate in activities during the day and in the evenings.

The cost for the accommodation including all meals and supervised activities is £119 per child. The cost of the coach will depend on how many children take part in the residential trip and we will not be able to go ahead with the trip unless we have at least 20 children taking part. Once we know final numbers (i.e. once deposits are paid), we will be able to give a final total. The maximum total cost will be £140 per child.

We would encourage the whole class to take part in the residential trip, as this will be a very valuable experience for your child.

We will be offering an information session for parent/carers to attend closer to the trip date, so they can find out more about the activities the children will be participating in and further information on the Kingswood Centre. We will also be giving information on clothing and footwear the children will need for the trip.

We would like you to confirm if you would like your child to take part in the Y4 Residential Trip by giving consent on ParentMail and making the initial deposit payment of £40 as soon as possible. The final deadline for deposit payments is 28 September 2020. If we do not receive enough interest to make the trip viable, we will of course refund any payments made.

Once deposits have been paid, the remaining balance can be paid online in full or by instalments, but must have been paid by 28 February 2021.
