Testing those who are symptomatic of Covid19 is a key strategy in managing and reducing the spread of the virus.

Detailed below is the government guidance on what the symptoms are of Covid19:

- **a high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

In line with DFE guidance, anyone who is symptomatic we are asking that they are tested. Please note period of isolation for the person with symptoms is 10 days from the start of symptoms, a household member would need to isolate for 14 days.

School has received guidance from the Local Authority, which states that where families will not engage with the testing process of Covid19, school will not be able to authorise the absence and as such, no schoolwork will be provided during the period of absence.

Tuck Shop – Spring Term

We are continuing with the Tuck Shop of Fridays after Christmas, within the Class Bubbles in the same way as we have during the Autumn term since returning in September.

To further reduce the amounts of cash being received in school we are trying a slightly different payment method on ParentMail. A new payment item has been added which will operate in a similar way to the Breakfast Club.

Parents/Carers can put money on the account as necessary and each week when any of the children have tuck shop 40p will be deducted from the balance.

Whilst we are discouraging cash, being sent into school, if any is received it will be added to the child's account balance and then deducted weekly. Once a child's balance gets low, parents/carers will be notified so that accounts can be topped up. Both tuck shop and breakfast club are available in the **Accounts** section of ParentMail, not the payments section. If you have any queries regarding tuck shop or need help making payments please contact the school office.



Advent Events



As you will know, this time in our school year would normally be one of advent liturgies, nativities and other performances, all of which we would share as a school community. Unfortunately due to current restrictions we are working under, we are only going to be able to undertake some of our traditional advent events and these will be done in very different ways. Our children will, as always, continue to be exposed throughout Advent, to the key stories, messages and events that make up this wonderful season of the church's year. The lockdown, which only ended yesterday, prevented anyone who was not a professional actor/singer etc from undertaking rehearsals of any kind. This has therefore left the school with an extremely short window of time to undertake any kind of preparations for advent events etc and compounded with bubble closures, has meant that we are unable to offer all of these events this academic year. Our children will still take part in a Christingle service, within their own bubble and this will now be on Friday 18th in the afternoon. We have had enquiries from parents regarding if this will be live streamed/filmed. We are bound by the same safeguarding procedures, as we would do if the event were being held in school and due to these procedures, we are unable to live stream/film these events as not all our children have permissions for this.

We understand this is disappointing for all members of our school community. There is something that we have planned and organised as a school for parents/carers - unfortunately I am unable to tell you about this as it must be kept as a surprise!

We hope and pray that we may be in a position in the summer term where we can hold some performances/events for our school community to attend.

Breakfast Club January 2021

Thank you to everyone who responded to our Breakfast Club surveys. Having reviewed the responses and the needs of our families, we will be restarting the Breakfast Club after Christmas. Following this feedback, we will initially be continuing with a drop in provision. This will be slightly different for the children in school to ensure they remain in their class bubbles. We will continue to review how successful this is during the first half term and may need to make some change if this becomes un-manageable as a drop in session.

Breakfast Club will restart on **Monday 11 January 2021**. Drop off will be between **8:00 and 8:30am** with strictly no admissions after 8:30. The cost for the first term is **£2 per session** (a reduction due to the free breakfast provision currently available in school). Payment will need to be made in advance via ParentMail (this will be available shortly to make payments), and accounts will be charged daily after each attendance. If there are insufficient funds on your child's account, they will be allowed to attend that day, but will subsequently, not be given entry until there are sufficient funds paid to their Breakfast Club Account.

Children must be brought to the main entrance by a parent/carer - please queue up the ramp, following the 2m markings. Children will sign in at reception as normal; however, **no cash will be accepted in school**.

Remote learning:

We would like to say a huge well done and thank you to our families for the support provided for our children with remote learning during bubble isolations. The quality of work that we are receiving from the children is amazing. We acknowledge that this is a challenging time for our school community and that many of our parents/carers are working from home while supporting their child with remote learning. You are all doing an amazing job! The main way that teachers/teaching assistants will communicate during any bubble closures is via parent mail and e-mail. Part of our remote learning offer is to provide some booster sessions for some of our children via zoom but this does take some organising. It would really help us out if you receive an e-mail re this from one of our staff that you do respond to confirm if you would like your child to participate. Thank you for your support.

Christmas Cards/ Gifts



We know that many families bring in cards/gifts etc at Christmas and we do very much appreciate these very kind gestures. However, in the current situation, the advice issued is the same as it was in Summer- the giving of gifts must be discouraged because of the risk of virus transmission. Unfortunately, this applies to children giving Christmas cards/gifts to other children.

WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



Last Sunday (29th November) was the first Sunday of Advent. Advent marks the beginning of the Church's year. The word ADVENT comes from the Latin word 'adventus' which means 'arrival', 'coming' or 'a drawing near'. During Advent, Christians focus on preparing for a three-fold coming.

- The coming of Christ in history (the birth of Jesus which we celebrate on December 25) and a remembrance of how the people of God waited expectantly for the Messiah;
- How Advent encourages believers to prepare to meet Jesus who comes every day in their lives;
- That believers wait in joyful expectation for Jesus to come again in glory at the end of time (the Second Coming).

Therefore Advent affirms that:

- Christ has come
- He is present in the world today
- He will come again in power.

Advent is a time of waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus into the world. It is also a penitential season; one that prepares Christians for the Second Coming (hence the liturgical colour of the season is purple). Advent has a strong, positive message. Simply put it is – 'get ready!' Or as the Scriptures put it – 'prepare the way of the Lord'. For Catholics the call to work for charity and the common good are heightened during Advent. It is a time of renewal, personal growth and transformation.

There are so many beautiful readings at this time of the year, wonderful symbolism of the Advent wreath and Advent colours. The deeper we understand Advent as an opportunity to draw closer to God then the deeper and richer our appreciation of the true meaning of Christmas will be. We can try to spread joy and peace to those we live with not so much by any great announcements but by the small everyday things we do both at home and in our places of work. This was St Therese's 'little way.' Mother Teresa also said that it is not what we give that counts so much as the love with which we give it.

With the dark evenings and short days, light is a particularly powerful symbol. It only takes the light from one small candle to dispel a great deal of darkness and one act of kindness to transform someone's day. If you have an Advent Candle or wreath at home it is nice to light it every evening and think and say a prayer for the people you love.

We have made a great start to our use of Maths with Parents and we have been really pleased with the amount of you that have signed up.


As a school, we are aiming for 100% of each class signing up and making the most of this great resource. Please look at the bar chart below to see the percentages for each class.




3. Click on this button
