

Newsletter – Issue 23 Week Commencing – 01 March 2021

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As you will be aware, Mr. Johnson announced on Monday 22nd February that it is his intention that schools will fully re-open on Monday 8th March 2021. Up until this date, attendance is only for eligible children.

We look forward to welcoming all children back on 8th March!

Please help everyone by adhering to the social distancing rules set by the government and keep yourselves and your family safe.

Testing those who are symptomatic of Covid19 is a key strategy in managing and reducing the spread of the virus.

Detailed below is the government guidance on what the symptoms are of Covid19:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

In line with DFE guidance, anyone who is symptomatic we are asking that they are tested. Please note the period of isolation for the person with symptoms is 10 days from the start of symptoms, a household member would need to isolate for 10 days. Day 1 is the day after symptoms or the day after a positive test if no symptoms.

Here is a reminder of the key protective measures we are asking you to follow. (Please do not be offended if school staff remind you regarding the below, it is about working together to help stop the spread of the virus).

- Please keep 2m apart from anyone not in your household- this helps to limit the spread of the virus. There are 2m markings throughout the school site to support this.
- Please wear a face mask/covering on school site unless you are exempt.
- Please keep your child/children with you at all times- this supports the protective bubble we have in place in school.
- Although we love to chat to our families, in order to keep lines moving, please phone/email or send a note into school with any messages, for staff.
- Only 1 parent/carer per family to come on school site at drop off/pick up times- this helps to keep the number of people on school site at any one time to a minimum.

Please note: Children under 5 receive free milk as well as those on income based free school meals.




Please could children return all books/equipment/laptops, which have been loaned since January when they return to school on Monday 8th March.

To mark this day, each class will be off timetable to complete book, genre and author-related activities; watch out for tweets which will showcase the fun each bubble has!

As always, children are very welcome to come to school dressed as their favourite book character, or in keeping with their chosen class theme. Teachers will also be doing lots of 'reading aloud' of books which the children can choose for enjoyment! Please see below for details of what your child's class will be up to!

Class	Activities
F2	F2 will be spending the day listening to our favourite traditional tales. We have lots of fun activities planned throughout the week linked to each tale including baking, singing songs and role-play. I wonder if we will find the Big Bad Wolf?
Y1	Year 1 will be spending the day creating our own original book characters – a heroic character and a villainous character! We will create artwork and fantastic descriptions for each character too! In the afternoon, we will make up stories about our two characters and do some storytelling and performance to share our stories with the class!
Y2	Year 2 will be taking part in 'The Masked Reader' competition! Come dressed up as a favourite author or book character, but do NOT tell anyone who you are! We will write our own descriptive clues and art work to hand out to others and complete some drama in order to help others guess who you are!
Y3	Year 3 will be thinking about their favourite books which they enjoy reading in school and at home. We will be dressing up as a character from our favourite book. Throughout the day, we will be producing artwork for our book, re-writing a different ending or a part of the book, taking part in a drama performance and writing a review.
Y4	Year 4 will be looking a range of picture books by Anthony Browne, Oliver Jeffers, Lemony Snicket and David Weisner. Throughout the day, we will produce artwork, a piece of independent writing, a drama performance and a comic based on the books that we read.
Y5	Year 5 will be diving deeper into our class book, "The Firework-Maker's Daughter". We will take part in drama activities based on what we have read so far and create character profiles. In a DT lesson, we will be creating 3D models of Mount Merapi. We will then use our models to conduct a science experiment, where we will replicate a volcanic eruption!
Y6	Year 6 will be making the characters and scenes in our story come to life. The children will be dressing up as any character from our class book, "The Spiderwick Chronicles". We will be writing alternative endings to the story, creating our own "creature" in an art lesson and designing a new house for Thimbletack in a DT lesson!!
