Please help everyone by adhering to the social distancing rules and the changing Government Road Map, to keep yourselves and your family safe.

Testing those who are symptomatic of Covid19 is a key strategy in managing and reducing the spread of the virus.

Detailed below is the government guidance on what the symptoms are of Covid19:

- **a high temperature** this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

In line with DFE guidance, anyone who is symptomatic we are asking that they be tested. Please note the period of isolation for the person with symptoms is 10 days from the start of symptoms, a household member would need to isolate for 10 days. Day 1 is the day after symptoms or the day after a positive test if no symptoms.

Here is a reminder of the key protective measures we are asking you to follow. (Please do not be offended if school staff remind you regarding the below, it is about working together to help stop the spread of the virus).

- Please keep 2m apart from anyone not in your household- this helps to limit the spread of the virus. There are 2m markings throughout the school site to support this.
- Please wear a face mask/covering on school site unless you are exempt.
- Please keep your child/children with you at all times- this supports the protective bubble we have in place in school.
- Although we love to chat to our families, in order to keep lines moving, please phone/email or send a note into school with any messages, for staff.
- Only 1 parent/carer per family to come on school site at drop off/pick up times- this helps to keep the number of people on school site at any one time to a minimum.
- Once you have dropped off/picked up your child/children, please do not congregate in groups outside the school gates. We ask that families move away from the entrance/exit to avoid causing congestion, which causes problems for others entering or leaving the school site.

Breakfast Club March 2021



Since Breakfast Club has restarted, the number of children attending has been very low. We will monitor this for the next two weeks. If the numbers remain low, the club will not be feasible to run and we will have to suspend it until later in the year.

Drop off is between **8:00am and 8:30am** with strictly no admissions after 8:30am. The cost is **£2 per session** (a reduction due to the free breakfast provision currently available in school). Payment will need to be made in advance via ParentMail, and accounts will be charged daily after each attendance. If there are insufficient funds on your child's account, they will be allowed to attend that day, but will subsequently, not be given entry until there are sufficient funds paid to their Breakfast Club Account.

Children must be brought to the main entrance by a parent/carer - please queue up the ramp, following the 2m markings. Children will sign in at reception as normal; however, no cash will be accepted in school.

Step 5a (Automatic): Book Appointments Confirm Appointment Time: If you chose the automatic booking mode, you'll see provisional appointments which are held for 2 minutes. To keep them, choose Accept at the bottom left. If it wasn't possible to book every selected teacher during the times you are able to attend, you can either adjust the teachers you wish to meet with and try again, or switch to manual booking mode (Step 5b). Step 5b (Manual): Book Appointments Click any of the green cells to make an appointment. Blue cells signify where you already have an appointment. Grey cells are unavailable. To change an appointment, delete the original by hovering over the blue box and clicking Delete. Then choose an alternate time. Once you're finished booking all appointments, at the top of the page in the alert box, press click here to finish the booking process.



Step 6: Finished

All your bookings now appear on the My Bookings page. An email confirmation has been sent and you can also print appointments by pressing *Print*. Click *Subscribe to Calendar* to add these and any future bookings to your calendar.

To change your appointments, click on Amend Bookings.

VE Day in St Thomas More

Victory in Europe Day - also known as VE Day - celebrates the Allied Forces accepting the Nazi's unconditional surrender from World War 2. The final document was signed on 8 May 1945. Today, countries throughout the world celebrate VE Day annually, on either 8th or 9th of May. This year, the UK will celebrate the 76th anniversary of this special day on Saturday 8th May, but we will be celebrating throughout the week.

We have planned lots of activities for our children to enjoy in celebration!

Y1	Y1 will be learning about what VE day is, and why it is such a significant part of British history. We will think about the bravery people showed in the war and try to imagine what people must have felt like during this time. For our activity, we will be listening to some war-time music and designing our own bravery medals!
Y2	Y2 will be learning about VE and why people celebrated with street parties, and how this brought others together as one. We will have our own mini-party and design our own bunting for it!
Y3	Y3 will be learning about what devastation the war caused and how VE Day was a big celebration across Britain in 1945. We will be making diary entries as a person who lived during this time, describing what has been happening and how we are going to celebrate VE Day. To get into the spirit of 1945, we will be listening to music that was popular in 1940s Britain!
Y4	Y4 will be using secondary and primary sources about VE and will be placing their favourite facts onto a flag, which they will be able to take home. It will be a party atmosphere and we will be playing celebration music from that time.
Y5	Y5 will be learning about why VE day was such a significant event in British History and how people across the country celebrated. We will be listening to Winston Churchill's radio broadcast announcing VE day in 1945 and we will be writing and recording our own announcement speeches! We will also listen to war-time music and design VE day decorations such as flags and bunting.
Y6	Y6 will be listening to music from the 1940s and they will be having a big sing- along!
