Breakfast Club is open every day and continues to be a drop in session. No pre booking is required, which provides flexibility to drop off between 8:00am and 8:30am, with strictly no admissions after 8:30am.

The cost is £3 per session. Payment in advance via ParentMail (cash payments are not accepted in school.) and accounts are charged daily after each attendance. If there are insufficient funds on your child's account, they will be allowed to attend that day, but will subsequently, not be given entry until there are sufficient funds paid to their Breakfast Club Account.

Children must be brought to the main entrance by a parent/carer. Children sign in at reception then can enjoy breakfast and play before school starts at 8:50am.

#### Communication



We are pleased to see so many of our families engaging with the school, through the various methods of communication available, such as Dojo, the Class emails, etc.

If you do make contact directly through Dojo or email, particularly if this is after or before school or over a weekend for example, please be aware that you may not get an immediate response.

Staff will aim to respond as soon as they can, but may not be in school or may be teaching all day, so unable to answer your questions or queries.

### Drop off and Pick up



Can we remind families that the one way system in school still remains in place. We have kept the system to try and avoid congestion around school at drop off and pick up times.

Please can families drop off and pick up their children and leave the site promptly. If you need to speak with a member of staff please were possible avoid blocking the pathways and flow of people through the school site.

We also ask that parents/carers keep their children with them as much as possible whilst leaving school, to avoid groups of children waiting at the gate or adults waiting for children who are still running around on the field, which causes a bottle neck around the exit gate.

## F2 Welcome Liturgy

Following the easing of COVID19 restrictions, we are pleased to welcome families back into school for our F2 Welcome Liturgy will take place on Thursday 7 October 2021 at 9:15 am.

The Liturgy, will be strictly one parent/carer per family and we are asking that places are reserved using the online form which will be emailed out to F2 families shortly.

On the day we ask that parents/carers drop off their children as normal, then exit the site via the one way system and wait outside the main pedestrian gate until 9:10 am, before returning to the School reception where the adults will be registered against the online bookings before being given entry to the school hall. We also ask visiting adults to wear a face covering whilst in the school building.

### Year 6 Residential

# Due to circumstances beyond our control the Y6 Residential destination and dates have been changed.

The children will now be going to York instead of Whitby on Monday 27 June 2022 to Wednesday 29 June 2022. We do not have the full trip costs at this stage due to the change in dates and destination, but anticipate the total cost to be between £130 and £150 per child.

In order to secure the Youth Hostel Association accommodation in York we need a £20 per child deposit to be paid by 8 October 2021, with the balance to be paid in full by the 1 April 2022. £20 Deposit will be available to pay via Parent Mail from 4pm today

Whilst we currently do not know the total cost, we thought that it would help families plan for the payments if we gave a date for the full payment to be made.
