Breakfast Club is open every day and continues to be a drop in session. No pre booking is required, which provides flexibility to drop off between 8:00am and 8:30am, with strictly no admissions after 8:30am.

The cost is £3 per session. Payment in advance via ParentMail (cash payments are not accepted in school.) and accounts are charged daily after each attendance. If there are insufficient funds on your child's account, they will be allowed to attend that day, but will subsequently, not be given entry until there are sufficient funds paid to their Breakfast Club Account.

Can we just remind parents that Children must be brought to the main entrance by a parent/carer. Children sign in at reception then can enjoy breakfast and play before school starts at 8:50am.

# When do I need to self-isolate?

To keep life moving and stop Covid-19 from spreading further, it's still important to self-isolate when you're asked to.

There are new rules from 16 August:

I've tested positive for Covid-19



You need to **self-isolate**, even if you've been vaccinated

I'm double-jabbed or I'm under 18 - and I've been in contact with someone who's tested positive



You do not need to self-isolate but we advise you to take a PCR test, and you need to self-isolate if it's positive

I've had either one or no jabs and I'm 18 or over - and I've been in contact with someone who's tested positive



You need to self-isolate

I have symptoms of Covid-19 (high temperature, new continuous cough, loss or change to sense of smell or taste)





You should **self-isolate and take a PCR test**, even if you've been vaccinated

## F2 Welcome Liturgy

# <u>Y5 Trip to Ripon Prison and Police Museum</u> <u>Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2021</u>

In Y5, we are learning all about crime and punishment through the ages. As part of our learning, the class will be visiting Ripon Prison and Police Museum. During our visit, the class will take part in a historic trial at the Courthouse in the morning with scripts and costume, weighing the evidence and deciding on a verdict. We will then be going to the Prison & Police Museum in the afternoon, where we will take part in some more fun activities! We will be leaving the school building at 8.30am, so please ensure that your child arrives at school for 8.20am. We will be arriving back to school at 3:45pm, so please be aware of the slightly later pick up time if your child does not have permission to leave the school premises alone. Children will be required to wear school uniform, and they must bring their own packed lunch for the day. If you require a packed lunch from school, please contact the office.

# Year 6 York Residential
