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Breakfast Club is open every day and continues to be a drop in session. No pre booking is required, which provides flexibility to drop off between 8:00am and 8:30am, with strictly no admissions after 8:30am.

The cost is £3 per session. Payment in advance via ParentMail (cash payments are not accepted in school.) and accounts are charged daily after each attendance. If there are insufficient funds on your child's account, they will be allowed to attend that day, but will subsequently, not be given entry until there are sufficient funds paid to their Breakfast Club Account.

Can we just remind parents that children must be brought to the main entrance by a parent/carer. Children sign in at reception then can enjoy breakfast and play before school starts at 8:50am.

Covid Guidance

- Do not send your child to school if they have any of the three main symptoms
- Do take your child for a PCR if they have signs of any symptoms
- Do isolate if you have tested Positive for Covid

Please do not send your child to school if they are showing any of the symptoms of Covid If your child comes into school and we notice them having any symptoms we will telephone you to collect your child immediately!

Covid-19: Self-isolation



When do I need to self-isolate?

To keep life moving and stop Covid-19 from spreading further, it's still important to self-isolate when you're asked to.

There are new rules from 16 August:

I've tested positive for Covid-19



You need to **self-isolate**, even if you've been vaccinated

I'm double-jabbed or I'm under 18 - and I've been in contact with someone who's tested positive



You do not need to self-isolate but we advise you to take a PCR test, and you need to self-isolate if it's positive

I've had either one or no jabs and I'm 18 or over - and I've been in contact with someone who's tested positive



You need to self-isolate

I have symptoms of Covid-19 (high temperature, new continuous cough, loss or change to sense of smell or taste)





You should **self-isolate and take a PCR test**, even if you've been vaccinated


The slots will be: 09:00 - 10:30, 10:30 - 12:00, 12:00 - 13:30 and 13:30 - 15:00

"Virtues to Live by"



Dear parents/carers,

STM will be starting a new year-long activity with the children celebrating "Virtues to Live By". This is a Diocesan initiative in which several other Catholic schools are participating.

We will have four virtues to focus on for every term. In our Key Stage Assemblies, the children will be participating in a collective worship based around the theme. Every class will have posters displayed in class around that theme, including how to "live out" the theme in real life.

Then every Friday, during Celebration Assembly, one child from each class will receive a certificate if they have displayed this virtue consistently or in a special way during the week. This will also be shared weekly in our newsletter.

Here is some information about the programme:

Guiding Principles

To ensure children and young people are given opportunities to:

- 1. Experience a positive and purposeful ethos providing a sense of belonging to their school community.
- 2. Grow in their knowledge and understanding of the virtues.
- 3. Practise the virtues to further the call to live life to the full.
- 4. Appreciate the connection between biblical and practical wisdom and living.
- 5. Hear the Christian story and encounter it in practice.
- 6. Understand their uniqueness and dignity as made in the image and likeness of God.
- 7. Know that our limitations are also opportunities for growth.
- 8. To notice, to reflect, to pray and to play
- 9. To exercise the cognitive, affective and behavioural components of character: know it in your head, feel it in your heart and show it with your hands.

Y5 Future Flyers PSHE Provision
