
The slots will be: 09:00 - 10:30, 10:30 - 12:00, 12:00 - 13:30 and 13:30 - 15:00

Dear parents/carers,

STM will be starting a new year-long activity with the children celebrating "Virtues to Live By". This is a Diocesan initiative in which several other Catholic schools are participating.

We will have four virtues to focus on for every term. In our Key Stage Assemblies, the children will be participating in a collective worship based around the theme. Every class will have posters displayed in class around that theme, including how to "live out" the theme in real life.

Then every Friday, during Celebration Assembly, one child from each class will receive a certificate if they have displayed this virtue consistently or in a special way during the week. This will also be shared weekly in our newsletter.

Here is some information about the programme:

Guiding Principles

To ensure children and young people are given opportunities to:

- 1. Experience a positive and purposeful ethos providing a sense of belonging to their school community.
- 2. Grow in their knowledge and understanding of the virtues.
- 3. Practise the virtues to further the call to live life to the full.
- 4. Appreciate the connection between biblical and practical wisdom and living.
- 5. Hear the Christian story and encounter it in practice.
- 6. Understand their uniqueness and dignity as made in the image and likeness of God.
- 7. Know that our limitations are also opportunities for growth.
- 8. To notice, to reflect, to pray and to play

9. To exercise the cognitive, affective and behavioural components of character: know it in your head, feel it in your heart and show it with your hands.

Year 2 Ancient Egypt Weston Park Museum

On Friday 19th November. Y2 are going to visit the Ancient Egypt gallery at Weston Park Museum. The children will be meeting Djedma'atiuesankh, a young Ancient Egyptian who has somehow ended up in Sheffield! The children will ask her questions and use primary and secondary resources to find out more about her life exploring what her story might be beyond her life and how she came to be in a museum in Sheffield. The children will each make a small artefact for Djedma'atiuesank. The contribution is £13.00 per child, including entry and transport. Payments should be made & consent given on Parentmail. Packed lunch options can also be found on Parentmail

Y5 Future Flyers PSHE Provision
