At St Thomas More our Mission is to love and to become the wonderful person God created us to be.



Advent is such an important and special time for us here at St Thomas More. It is a real opportunity to explore this liturgical season with our children and families. As parents/carers have been unable to come into school for such a long time we want to facilitate you being able to attend our Advent events, whilst keeping everyone safe and ensure we consider business continuity. We know that the larger the events and the more mixing, the more likely an outbreak will occur and we want to avoid this and keep any disruption for children, families and staff to a minimum. We have therefore decided that each class will lead an Advent performance eq a liturgy and parents/carers will be able to attend. The class performing their Advent event will be the only class of children in the hall. A max of 2 parent/carers per family (of the class that are doing the Advent performance) will be able to attend. This allows us to manage capacity within our hall and keep mixing to a minimum and maintain a level of social distancing between visitors. Prior to each Advent event, families will be invited via parent-mail and asked to complete a form, providing details of the 2 parent/carers/family members that will be attending. Please note, the 2 family members attending will be seated together and be required to wear face coverings, any younger family members attending are to be included in the 2 - for example a parent and a younger sibling would count as 2. Please note, if school is experiencing any outbreaks or there is any change to the guidance, then events may need to be re-scheduled or cancelled.

## <u>Covid Update</u>

In light of recommendations from the LA we are asking any family members attending the Advent Liturgies to take a lateral flow test prior to entering the school building, this is in addition to wearing a mask on site!

#### What to do if your child has symptoms

If your child develops one of the three mains symptoms, Government Guidelines say you must book them a PCR not do a Lateral flow. We have had evidence that in the early stages of Covid a lateral flow doesn't always detect a positive case. Any other member of the house hold can continue as normal ie attending school etc unless they develop symptoms, unless contact has been confirmed as the new Omicron variant.

#### One way System Drop off and Pick up

Can we remind families that the one-way system in school remains in place. We have kept the system to try to avoid congestion on our narrow paths around school at drop off and pick up times.

Please can families drop off, pick up their children, and leave the site promptly. If you need to speak with a member of staff please where possible, avoid blocking the pathways and flow of people through the school site.

We also ask that parents/carers keep their children with them whilst leaving school, to avoid groups of children waiting at the gate or adults waiting for children who are still running around on the field, which causes a bottleneck around the exit gate.

Raffle tickets are now on sale, the tickets are available on Parentmail and the cost is  $\pounds 1$  each.




Tuesday the 14<sup>th</sup> December children can bring in money to buy raffle tickets for the Hampers.

#### EYFS and KS1 Christmas Drama Workshop Friday 17 December 2021

On Friday 17 December 2021, F2, Y1 and Y2 get to experience an in-school live performance from West End in Schools!

The Christmas spirit will be brought into school with a drama workshop and we will join Scrooge on his adventures through Victorian London based on A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens!

#### <u>Y1 trip to National Emergency Services Museum</u> <u>Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> February</u>

On Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2022, Year 1 children will visit the National Emergency Services Museum in Sheffield to learn all about the history of The Great Fire of London. Children will travel back in time to 1666 when King Charles II was on the throne and a huge fire ravaged London, to learn how the Great Fire was extinguished and the legacy it holds. Children will get the opportunity to handle real and replica objects, dress up as a soldier fighting the fire and try some of the methods they used. This workshop is in collaboration with South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue bringing history and vital life safety together.

The coach will be leaving school around 9.15am so please arrive to school promptly as normal. We will be returning to school before the end of the school day (approx. 2.30pm).

The contribution is £13, which includes the workshop and coach travel.

Payments should be made and consent given on parentmail.
