The children used a range of cooking skills such as grating, slicing and weighing ingredients. They were eager to taste what they had made. Well done Class 4!







British Science Week 8th- 17th March 2024



During British Science Week, children will be taking part in exciting activities linked to this year's theme of Time. Take a look below to see what your class will be doing during British Science Week:

F2	See & Eat Grow a Beanstalk F2 will explore the life cycle of a vegetable, following its journey from root to harvest. They will plant their own green beans and describe the different stages of their growth.
Y1	Changing apples Class 1 will delve into the world of apple varieties. They'll use their sense to describe the apples' appearances and textures, and even taste them! They'll discover the smallest, tallest and widest varieties, and observe apple cores over time.
Y2	Nature's Future Nature in the UK is in trouble – it's future is in our hands! Can you imagine a better future for nature on our school grounds? Class 2 will be taking action together to make a change!
Y3	Can you use the sun to tell the time? Before clocks were invented, people told the time using sundials. Class 3 will be making a gnomon (the projecting piece of a sundial) from a selection of materials and observing how the shadow cast by it changes during the day.
Y4	The Big Plastic Count: It's time for change! The Big Plastic Count (11-17 th March) is the UK's biggest household plastic waste investigation. Class 4 will be joining thousands of schools and households across the UK by counting how much plastic waste they throw away, gathering vital evidence to present the true scale of the problem to the government. Keep an eye out on our class dojo page for further information!
Y5	Make your own pendulum timer! Class 5 will be becoming engineers by learning about pendulums and making one themselves. They'll experiment with ways to slow down its swing and even explore different types of swings. Are you up to the challenge Class 5?

Y6 Design a farm of the future!

Farming is often described as the 'world's oldest profession,' but what does the future hold for farming? There are over 8 billion people on Earth, up from only 1 billion in the year 1800. Class 6 will be exploring how farmers can rise to the challenge of feeding everyone whilst also looking after our planet.

The British Science Week 2024 Poster Competition

STM will be taking part in British Science Week 2024 (8-17th March 2024), which marks the Week's 30th anniversary. The theme this year is 'Time' - there are loads of STEM topics to be explored!

 - Content Clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic
 - Effective Communication Communicated in an engaging way

The judges will choose a winner from the following age categories: Early years, Infant (Y1-Y3) and junior (Y4-Y6).



CELEBRATE WORLD BOOK DAY 2024



It's soon approaching that time of year once again, the time that we love in St Thomas More... World Book Day! World Book Day is taking place this year on Thursday 7th March and we are inviting all children and staff to get involved! Our teachers have been extremely busy planning ideas for each class. We will be holding a whole school 'best-dressed competition' and a whole school writing competition. We would love for children to come to school all dressed up and we would like to invite children to bring in a favourite book on the day if they would like to. Take a look below to see what your class are doing for World Book Day 2024:

- F2's World Book Day theme is 'Traditional Tales'! Children can come dressed up as their favourite character from a traditional tale-The Gingerbread Man, Goldilocks, Billy Goats Gruff, Little Red Riding hood....! The choice is yours. We will be going on an adventure around school to look for clues to try and figure out which character is causing mischief! We will also be doing lots of art, drama and of course reading many traditional tales throughout the day!
- Year 1's theme this year is Wild About Reading! The children will spend the day writing an information fact-file about their chosen animal. We would like the children to send a 'caught in the wild' photograph of them reading in the most unusual place!
- Y2 will be having a Dr Seuss Day! We will be learning all about Dr Seuss, diving into some of his most famous characters such as the Grinch, Lorax, Fish, Cat in the Hat and many more. The children will be drawing, listening to stories and reading lots of his books. They will also be using the book to help to create their own Dr Seuss puppets.
- Year 3 are experiencing the scrumdiddlyumptious joy of reading this World Book Day, through sharing and celebrating the works of our favourite author Roald Dahl. We will be creating our own marvellous medicines, tasting the delights of the chocolate factory, and spending our day in our own class library just like the clever Matilda.





Returning the projects: You can return the projects at any point throughout this term but please be aware that the final date for their return is Wednesday 27th March.

EYFS	Please see Dojo for information about a wider range of activities to support learning across all aspects of EYFS		
Y1	Leaf and flower rubbing: Collect some flowers and leaves, place paper on top of them and rub with crayor or chalk to create a wonderful piece of art! Challenge: Can you spot 2 evergreen trees and 2 deciduous trees? Write some facts about their appearance.		
Y2	Map of the world: Create an artistic Map of the world that has a focus on the continents and ocean Challenge: Pick a country from a continent on the map and create a fact file about it.		
Y3	What is it like in Sheffield? Create a piece of artwork, depicting the landscape and history of Sheffield. Challenge: Write a report about how the landscape of Sheffield has changed over time.		
Y4	Biomes: Create a model of your chosen biome inside a box e.g. tundra, desert, tropical rainforest. Include some of the plant and animal species found in your chosen biome. Challenge: Write a non-chronological report about the biome that you have chosen.		
Y5	Blast off: Create a rocket and evidence its 'take-off'. Produce a poster of your rocket upon its completion, and label the forces at play as it sets off. Challenge: Create a script which you can read over the top of your rocket setting off. This script should have information around the specific forces which are taking place		
Y6	Healthy Me! Consider the ways in which you can take care of both your physical and your mental health. Create a booklet or a PowerPoint presentation as a guide to help someone live a healthy lifestyle. Challenge: Write a letter to the Prime Minister asking him to consider something to improve health (e.g. ban the sale of cigarettes, improve free sports clubs in the city).
